Skilled Migrant Category to New Zealand

New Zealand offers many opportunities for skilled migrants, especially in industries and regions experiencing growth and skill shortages.

The Skilled Migrant Category (SMC) has been designed to give priority to meeting those needs and opportunities. If you are interested in migrating to New Zealand based on your skills that we may need, then please contact us so that we can make your dream come through.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- * Good health and good character
- * 56 years or younger
- * English language requirements
- * Score at least a total of 100 points in skilled employment, work experience, qualifications and age.

THE PROCESS

Before you start, first check with your Immigration Adviser if you meet the required threshold of 100 points.

When you believe that it is worthwhile submitting an Expression of Interest, gather all the documents to complete the EOI hard copy of online. You will need at least 100 points to submit an EOI.

The EOIs are submitted into a

the pool and periodically selected as follows;

- 140 points or more are automatically selected
- more than 100 but less than 140 plus an offer of employment, or current skilled employment, are selected based on ranking

Once selected you may be Invited to Apply for Residency in New Zealand

When you receive an Invitation to Apply, you will need to send all the supporting and evidential documents confirming the points you have claimed in your EOI.

Medicals, character certificates and English language ability also need to be supported with the necessary documents.

When Immigration New Zealand is satisfied that you meet the criteria, you will get your residency in New Zealand, also known as PR.

What does this mean?

SMC - Skilled Migrant Category
EOI - Expression of Interest
ITA - Invitation to Apply for residence
PR - Permanent Residence
ANZSCO - Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations

SKILLED EMPLOYMENT

Skilled Employment is employment that requires specialist, technical or management experience obtained through completion of recognised qualifications, or relevant work experience, or a combination of the above.

Skilled Employment is also measured and recognised in three manners;

- Educational level
- Level of salary/payment
- Job description with tasks and duties as per ANZSCO

This is the applicable points table for the Skilled Migrant Category where points are allocated based on the various factors. These points may be changed from time to time.

The minimum level of points is at least 100 points

Two years of full-time study in New Zealand completing a recognised bachelor degree (level seven on the NZQF) New Zealand qualification	10
One year of full-time study in New Zealand completing a recognised New Zealand qualification	10
Two years of full-time study in New Zealand completing a recognised New Zealand qualification	15
Qualification in an identified future growth area	10
Qualification in an area of absolute skill shortage	10
Partner qualifications – recognised level 4-6 qualification	10
